
#### Friday 19/07/2023

# Weekly Projects/Themes

#### Week 1- Making Beanie

The history of the beanie can be traced back to the early 20th century. Originally known as a "watch cap," it gained popularity among sailors, fishermen, and blue-collar workers who needed headwear that provided warmth and protection in cold weather conditions.

The word "bean" was considered American slang for "head" in the early 20th century. Apparently, some thought a bean resembled a head. When a baseball pitcher threw a pitch at a player's head, it was called a bean ball. Since the snug-fitting cap outlined the shape of the head, it became known as the beanie.

#### Week 2- Worm Farm

Vermiculture, which is also known as worm farm was first introduced in the 1970s by a biology teacher, Mary Appelhif. She developed the idea of using red wiggler worms (Eisenia fetida) for composting in indoor and outdoor systems to convert kitchen waste to worm compost.

Worm farming is another way to dispose of unwanted food waste and get a liquid fertiliser as well. Food scraps are placed in the worm farm regularly and special worm farm worms eat their way through it. The worms in a worm farm are different to the garden worms you find when digging in your garden.
